Primary Election Instructions

Dear Voter:

McPherson County is in hopes of updating all of our records and help you in the process by giving you options that best suit you this election season.

Please fill out the voter registration form and return it in the envelope provided. You can also include the **AV1** or **AV2**, if you would like to vote that way.

Primary Elections: You **must** pick a political party to receive a ballot.

How can you vote?

There are 3 ways you can cast your ballot in the 2020 Primary Election. Advance voting is a way to avoid lines or you may go to your polling place on Tuesday, August 4, 2020.

1. *Advance vote by mail - AV1

To receive a ballot by mail, fill out the enclosed advance ballot application and return it by fax, email, mail or in-person before the July 28 deadline.

The sooner we have your application, the sooner we can get your ballot mailed out. The **AV1** is only good for the election coming up. An **AV1** Must be filled out for **EVERY** election.

***Permanent Advance vote by mail - AV2**

If you have a permanent disability, you can receive a ballot for every election you qualify for.

To start receiving a ballot by mail every election, fill out the enclosed permanent advance ballot application and return it by fax, email, mail or in-person before the July 28 deadline.

The sooner we have your application, the sooner we can get your ballot mailed out.

2. * Advance vote in-person July 15 - August 3 @ noon

In-person advance voting starts at the McPherson County Courthouse

Office hours 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

3. * Vote on Election Day, August 4, 2020

Polls will be open from 7 am to 7 pm. Visit our website to find your polling location, precinct maps, candidate lists and other information you might need for Election Day.

You may return your ballot IN PERSON or by MAIL:

- If returning **IN PERSON**, this ballot **MUST be returned by 7PM** on **Election Day** to either:
 - *County Clerk's Office
 - *ANY polling location within the county
- If returning by **MAIL**, this ballot **MUST** be postmarked by Election Day and received in our office by the Friday after the election.

Be sure to follow **all** of the instructions on the return envelope:

1. You **MUST** sign the back of the envelope
2. If someone is delivering the envelope for you, they **must** sign also

Remember to bring your government issued photo I.D. to vote in person.

If applying to vote by mail, provide a Kansas driver's or non-driver's license number or a photocopy of you ID. A complete list of acceptable ID's is on our website. Free IDs are available if you don't have one; contact our office.
